The purpose of this award is to recognize the efforts and highlight the work and accomplishments of Ontario women who have devoted their lives in an effort to serve, promote and enhance the dairy industry. Contributions may be through their own family farms, within the 4-H program, local breed association, provincial committees or boards, national boards or through formal work, which all working together helps to promote and preserve the dairy farm and industry in Ontario.

4. Examples/descriptions of her leadership abilities a. Leadership roles (10 points) b. Inspiration to others (10 points) c. Assisting/encouraging other to also assume leadership roles (10 points)

5. Role in her own operation (20 points)

6. Letter of support (10 points)
